MATTHEW 1:17 JESUS' FAMILY TREE



- I This is the genealogy of Jesus the Messiah the son of David, the son of Abraham:
- 2 Abraham was the **father** of Isaac, Isaac the **father** of Jacob, Jacob the **father** of Judah and his brothers,
- 3 Judah the **father** of Perez and Zerah, whose <u>mother</u> was Tamar, Perez the **father** of Hezron, Hezron the **father** of Ram,
- 4 Ram the father of Amminadab, Amminadab the father of Nahshon, Nahshon the father of Salmon,
- 5 Salmon the **father** of Boaz, whose <u>mother</u> was Rahab, Boaz the **father** of Obed, whose <u>mother</u> was Ruth, Obed the **father** of Jesse,
- 6 and Jesse the **father** of King David. David was the **father** of Solomon, whose <u>mother</u> had been Uriah's wife, (Mt 1:1-6, NIV)



MATTHEW 1:1-17 JESUS' FAMILY TREE



- 7 Solomon the **father** of Rehoboam, Rehoboam the **father** of Abijah, Abijah the **father** of Asa[ph],
- 8 Asa[ph] the **father** of Jehoshaphat, Jehoshaphat the **father** of Jehoram, Jehoram the **father** of Uzziah,
- 9 Uzziah the father of Jotham, Jotham the father of Ahaz, Ahaz the father of Hezekiah,
- 10 **Hezekiah** the **father** of Manasseh, Manasseh the **father** of Amon, Amon the **father** of Josiah,
- II and Josiah the **father** of Jeconiah and his brothers at the time of the exile to Babylon. (Mt I:7-II, NIV)



MATTHEW 1:1-17 JESUS' FAMILY TREE



- 12 After the exile to Babylon: Jeconiah was the father of Shealtiel, Shealtiel the father of Zerubbabel,
- 13 Zerubbabel the father of Abihud, Abihud the father of Eliakim, Eliakim the father of Azor,
- 14 Azor the father of Zadok, Zadok the father of Akim, Akim the father of Elihud,
- 15 Elihud the father of Eleazar, Eleazar the father of Matthan, Matthan the father of Jacob,
- 16 and Jacob the **father** of Joseph, the <u>husband</u> of Mary, and Mary was the <u>mother</u> of Jesus who is called the Messiah.
- 17 Thus there were fourteen generations in all from **Abraham** to **David**, fourteen from **David** to the exile to Babylon, and fourteen from the exile to the **Messiah**. (Mt 1:17, NIV)



MATTHEW 1:17 THE BOOK OF GENESES



- I. Gen 2:4 (NIV): This is the account [Βίβλος γενέσεως | Biblos geneseos ("Book of genesis")] of the heavens and the earth when they were created
- 2. Gen 5:1(NIV): This is the written account [Book of genesis] of Adam's family line
- 3. Gen 6:9 (NIV): This is the account [genesis] of Noah and his family
- 4. Gen 10:1a (NIV): This is the account [genesis] of Shem, Ham and Japheth, Noah's sons...
- 5. Gen 11:10a (NIV): This is the account [genesis] of Shem's family line
- 6. Gen II:27 (NIV): This is the account [genesis] of Terah's [father of Abraham] family line
- 7. Gen 25:12a (NIV): This is the account [genesis] of the family line of Abraham's son Ishmael.
- 8. Gen 25:19 (NIV): This is the account [genesis] of the family line of Abraham's son Isaac.
- 9. Gen 36:1 (NIV):This is the **account [genesis]** of the **family line** of Esau (that is, Edom)
- 10. Gen 36:9 (NIV): This is the account [genesis] of the family line of Esau the father of the Edomites
- II. Gen 37:2 (NIV): This is the account [genesis] of Jacob's family line
- 12. Mt. I:I (NIV):This is the genealogy [Book of genesis] of Jesus the Messiah the son of David, the son of



MATTHEW 1:1-17 SON OF DAVID



- "The days are coming," declares the LORD, "when I will raise up for **David** a righteous Branch, a King who will reign wisely and do what is just and right in the land. 6 In his days Judah will be saved and Israel will live in safety. This is the name by which he will be called: The LORD Our Righteous Savior. (Jer 23:5-6, NIV)
- [To David] "'The LORD declares to you that the LORD himself will establish a house for you: I2 When your days are over and you rest with your ancestors, I will raise up your **offspring** to succeed you, your own **flesh and blood**, and I will establish his kingdom. I3 He is the one who will build a house for my Name, and I will **establish the throne of his kingdom forever** (2 Sam 7:1 Ib-13, NIV).



MATTHEW 1:1-17 SON OF ABRAHAM



- "I will make you into a great nation, and I will bless you; I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse; and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you." (Gen 12:2-3, NIV)
- Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, (Mt 28:19, NIV)



MATTHEW 1:1-17 SON OF JOSEPH?



• and Jacob the father of Joseph, the husband of Mary, and Mary was the **mother of Jesus** who is called the Messiah. (Mt 1:16, NIV)



MATTHEW 1:18 THE GENESIS OF JESUS



- The **genesis** of Jesus the Messiah went like this: His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, [but] before they came together, she was found to be pregnant from the Holy Spirit (Mt 1:18,AT)
- "27 "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall not commit adultery.' [cf. Ex 20:14; Dt 5:18] 28 But I tell you that anyone who **looks** at a woman **lustfully** has **already** committed adultery with her in his heart." (Mt 5:27-28, NIV)



MATTHEW 1:18 THE MESSIAH AND THE HOLY SPIRIT



- A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse [father of David]; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit. 2 **The Spirit of the LORD** will rest on him— the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding, the Spirit of counsel and of might, the Spirit of the knowledge and fear of the LORD— (Isa II:I-2, NIV)
- "Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom I delight; I will put my Spirit on him, and he will bring justice to the nations (Is 42: I, NIV)
- 15 Aware of this, Jesus withdrew from that place. A large crowd followed him, and he **healed** all who were ill. 16 He warned them **not** to tell others about him. 17 This was to **fulfill** what was spoken through the prophet **Isaiah**: 18 "Here is **my servant** whom I have **chosen**, the **one I love**, in whom I **delight**; I will put my **Spirit** on him, and he will proclaim justice to the nations. 19 He will not quarrel or cry out; no one will hear his voice in the streets. 20 A bruised reed he will not break, and a smoldering wick he will not snuff out, till he has brought justice through to victory. 21 In his name **the nations** will put their hope." (Mt 12:15-21, NIV; cf. Is 42:1-4)



MATTHEW 1:18 THE MESSIAH AND THE HOLY SPIRIT



- As soon as Jesus was baptized, he went up out of the water. At that moment heaven was opened, and he saw the **Spirit of God** descending like a dove and alighting on him. I7 And a voice from heaven said, "This is **my Son**, whom I love; with him I am well pleased." (Mt 3:16-17, NIV)
- The Spirit of the Sovereign LORD is on me, because the LORD has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor [i.e., humbled]... (Isa 61:1, NIV)
- If He went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, and on the Sabbath day he went into the synagogue, as was his custom. He stood up to read, I7 and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was handed to him. Unrolling it, he found the place where it is written: I8 "The **Spirit** of the Lord is on me, because he has **anointed** me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, I9 to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." 20 Then he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant and sat down. The eyes of everyone in the synagogue were fastened on him. 21 He began by saying to them, "Today this scripture is **fulfilled** in your hearing." (Lk 4:16-21, NIV)



MATTHEW 1:18 EXTRAORDINARY, CREATIVE SPIRIT



- In the beginning God **created** the heavens and the earth. 2 Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the **Spirit** [n:1 (*rûaḥ*)] of **God** was hovering over the waters (Gen 1:1-2, NIV)
- By the word of the LORD the heavens were **made**, their starry host by the breath [nin (*rûaḥ*)] of his mouth (Ps 33:6, NIV)



MATTHEW 1:19 JOE'S ALL RIGHT



•So her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and not wanting to disgrace her publicly, had in mind to divorce her privately (Mt 1:19,AT)



MATTHEW 1:20 JOSEPH HAD A DREAM(S)



But after these things were considered by him, behold: an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying:
"Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife. For [the Child] Who has been conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit (Mt 1:20,AT)







- For she will give birth to a son, and **you** shall call Him by the name Jesus because He will **save** His people from their **sins**. (Mt 1:21,AT)
- From that time on Jesus began to preach, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." (Mt 4:17, NIV)



MATTHEW 1:21 SALVATION FROM SIN FOR HIS PEOPLE



• 21 Once you were alienated from God and were enemies in your minds because of your evil behavior. 22 But now he has reconciled you by Christ's physical body through death to present you holy in his sight, without blemish and free from accusation—23 if you continue in your faith, established and firm, and do not move from the hope held out in the gospel. This is the gospel that you heard and that has been proclaimed to every creature under heaven, and of which I, Paul, have become a servant. (Col 1:21-23, NIV)
