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CONTEXT: FAITHFUL FATHER, DIVINE DELIVERY



16 Don't be deceived, my beloved brothers and sisters. 17 All good giving and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the [heavenly] lights – with whom there is no variation or shadow from turning. 18 According to His will, He gave us birth by the word of truth so that we might be a kind of firstfruits of His creatures. So be doers of [the] word and not only hearers – deluding yourselves. (Jas 1:22, AT)





Where there is strife, there is pride, but **wisdom** is found in those who **take advice**.

Plans fail for lack of counsel,

but with many advisers they succeed.

(Pr 15:22, NIV)





- 7 Whoever corrects a mocker invites insults;
 - whoever rebukes the wicked incurs abuse.

2 Consider it all joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face various trials, 3 knowing that the testing of your faith produces perseverance. (Jas 1:2-3, AT)

But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. (Mt 6:33, NIV)



JAMES 1:21 IF THE GOSPEL TAKES ROOT, THE GOSPEL MAKES FRUIT!



Therefore, stripping off [ἀποτίθεμαι | apotithemai] all [moral] filthiness and [the] abundance $[\pi\epsilon\rho\sigma\sigma\epsilon\alpha]$ *perisseia*] of evil, humbly [πραΰτης | *praÿtēs*] accept [δέχομαι | dechomai] the implanted word, which can save your souls [ψυχή | *psyche*]. (Jas 1:21, AT)



JAMES 1:21 STRIP OFF MORAL FILTH!



You took off [ἀποτίθεμαι | apotithemai]

- your former way of life, the old self that
- is corrupted by deceitful desires;
- (Eph 4:22, HCSB)



JAMES 1:21 STRIP OFF MORAL FILTH!



Therefore each of you must **put off** [ἀποτίθεμαι | *apotithemai*] falsehood and speak truthfully to your neighbor, for we are all members of one body. (Eph 4:25, NIV)





The night is far gone; the day is at hand. So then let us **cast off** [$\dot{\alpha}\pi \sigma \tau i\theta \epsilon \mu \alpha \imath$ | *apotithemai*] **the works of darkness** and put on the armor of light. (Rom 13:12, ESV)





8 But now you must get rid of $[\dot{\alpha}\pi \circ \tau (\theta \in \mu \alpha \iota \mid a potithemai)]$ all such things—anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive language from your mouth. 9 Do not lie to each other, since you have taken off your old self with its practices 10 and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge in the image of its Creator. (Col 3:8-10, NIV)





Therefore, rid yourselves [ἀποτίθεμαι] apotithemai] of all malice and all deceit, hypocrisy, envy, and slander of every kind. (1 Pet 2:1, NIV)





Pure and **undefiled** religion before [our] God and Father is this: to look after orphans and widows in their hardship [and] to keep oneself **unstained** from the world. (Jas 1:27, AT)



JAMES 1:21 AND THE ABUNDANCE OF EVIL!



The good person out of the good treasure of the heart produces good, and the evil person out of evil treasure produces evil; for it is out of the abundance [περισσεία | perisseia] of the heart that the mouth speaks. (Lk 6:45, NRSV)





22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, 23 gentleness [πραΰτης | praÿtēs] and selfcontrol. Against such things there is no law. (Gal 5:23, NIV)





Who is **wise** and **understanding** among you? Let them show it by their good life, by deeds done in the humility $[\pi\rho\alpha\ddot{\upsilon}\tau\eta\varsigma]$ praÿtēs] that comes from wisdom. (Jas 3:13, NIV)





And we also thank God continually because, when you received the word of God, which you heard from us, you **accepted** [δέχομαι | *dechomai*] it not as a human word, but as it actually is, the word of God, which is indeed at work in you who believe (1 Th 2:13, NIV)





Those on the rocky ground are the ones who **receive** [δέχομαι | *dechomai*] the **word** with joy when they hear it, but they have no root. They believe for a while, but in the time of testing they fall away. (Lk 8:13, NIV)





Therefore, everyone who hears these words of mine and **does them** will be like a wise man who built his house on the (hed)rock (Mt 7)24 AT)

(bed)rock. (Mt 7:24, AT)





According to His will, He gave us birth by the word of truth so that we might be a kind of firstfruits of His creatures. (Jas 1:18, AT)





- 31 "The days are coming," declares the LORD [YHWH], "when I will make a **new covenant** with the people of Israel and with the people of Judah.
- 32 It will not be like the covenant

I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to lead them out of Egypt, because they broke my covenant, though I was a husband to them,"

declares the LORD [YHWH]. (Jer 31:31-32, NIV)





- 33 "This is the covenant I will make with the people of Israel
 - after that time," declares the LORD [YHWH].
 - "I will **put my law in their minds** and **write it on their hearts**.
 - I will be their God,
 - and they will be my people.
- 34 No longer will they teach their neighbor, or say to one another, 'Know the LORD [YHWH],'
 because they will all know me, from the least of them to the greatest," declares the LORD [YHWH].
 - "For I will forgive their wickedness
 - and will remember their sins no more." (Jer 31:33-34, NIV)





In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the **new covenant in my blood**; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me." (1 Cor 11:25, NIV)





23 For you have been born again, not of perishable seed, but of imperishable, through the living and enduring word of God. 24 For, "All people are like grass, and all their glory is like the flowers of the field; the grass withers and the flowers fall, but the word of the Lord endures forever." 25 And this is the **word** that was preached to you. (1 Pet 1:23-25, NIV)





I planted the seed, Apollos watered

it, but God has been making it

grow. (1 Cor 3:6, NIV)





But those that were sown on the good soil are the ones who hear the word and accept [$\pi \alpha \rho \alpha \delta \epsilon \chi o \mu \alpha \iota$] [*paradechomai*] it and **bear fruit**, thirtyfold and sixtyfold and a hundredfold." (Mk 4:20, ESV)





I am the Shepherd – the Good One. The Shepherd – the Good One – lays down His life $[\psi v \chi \eta | psyche]$ for the sheep. (Jn 10:11, AT)





remember this: Whoever turns a sinner

- from the error of their way will save them
- from death and cover over a multitude of
- sins. (Jas 5:20, NIV)





For the message of the cross is

foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us **who are being saved** it is the power of God. (1 Cor 1:18, NIV)
